CITY OF EVERETT HONORED AT STATE HOUSE FOR EARLY VOTING *Mayor DeMaria announces early voting has begun in Everett*

Mayor Carlo DeMaria is excited to announce that Everett was one of 201 communities in the state that was recognized at the State House for providing more hours and days for residents to vote early. For the first time, Massachusetts' voters will be able to cast their ballots before Election Day, at their own convenience. This year, residents have the option to vote early at City Hall. Early voting began on Monday, October 24th and will continue through November 4th. To accommodate residents, Mayor DeMaria, Registrar of Voters Maureen DiPierro, and the Election Commission decided to offer weekend hours on Saturday, October 29th and Friday, November 4th.

Mayor DeMaria stated, "It is critically important that everyone exercises their right to vote. We are privileged to have been given this right by our Founding Fathers and for over 200 years our country has always had a peaceful transition of power by voting you help to continue that tradition and have a say in our government."

Tuesday, November 1 8:00 – 5:00

Wednesday, November 2 8:00 – 5:00

Thursday, November 3 8:00 – 7:30

Friday, November 4 6:00 am – 10:00 am

The Mayor's goal when implementing more hours and days for early voting was to increase voter participation as well relieve congestion at polling stations on election day.

The state law allows early voting in biennial statewide elections, starting 11 business days before an election and ending two business days before Election Day.
